What is EUAV?



- An opportunity for well trained and well prepared junior and senior humanitarian volunteers from the EU to help local communities in third countries
- Based on concrete humanitarian needs and gaps identified jointly by sending organisations in Member States and hosting organisations in third countries
- Providing technical assistance and capacity building for humanitarian organisations themselves – both sending and hosting - strengthening the system

What is EUAV?



- Supplementary tool complimentary to ECHO's core emergency response work — contributing to strengthening the resilience and capacity of local communities to deal with disasters
- Providing networking opportunities for organisations and volunteers – facilitating transnational partnerships, sharing knowledge and good practices, access to vacancies including online volunteering. Dedicated IT platform will be available May 2016.

Why EUAV?




- Solidarity responding to the requests of EU citizens to support those most in need in the world
- Increasing number of natural and man-made disasters more efforts needed to prevent hazards becoming disasters
- Need for more trained and well prepared people to support local organisations and communities
- Support for improvements in the humanitarian sector need for a stronger more robust system

ECHO Total budget: €7 516.3 million

The Pilot Phase 2011-2014



- 12 pilot projects in three phases funded under the action. 300 volunteers deployed in 49 third countries
- Lessons learnt:
 - Demand for humanitarian professionals
 - Demand for specific skills
 - Training provision central
 - Need for establishment of volunteer management standards
 - Demand for capacity building of local organisations to ensure lasting impact of the work.

The Programme for Organisations



- Certification leading to Deployment
 €8.4 million in 2016

 €7.6 million in 2016
- ECHO funding 85% of total project costs

The Programme for Volunteers




- From Member States age 18 or over junior and senior (min five years' experience) volunteers. Placements from 1 to 18 months
- Flights, accommodation, subsistence allowance and insurance provided – safety and security a priority - no deployment to conflict areas
- Centralised training and possibility of 6 months apprenticeship for junior volunteers
- Vacancies for specific profiles following needs assessment online volunteering also possible –from mid 2016



Submit Proposal



Certification



Ongoing call for applications for Certification of sending and hosting organisations (open until 2020)

Self assessment forms in which organisations:

- commit to adhere to the standards and procedures referred to in <u>Article 9 of Regulation (EU) 375/2014</u>
- confirm that they are active in the field of humanitarian aid as defined in point (d) of <u>Article 3 of Regulation (EU) 375/2014</u>

Deployment



- Call to be published: 1st or 2nd quarter 2016 Info-Day (date tbc)
- Activities: Deployment of senior and junior EU Aid Volunteers to humanitarian aid projects in the area of DRR in third countries based on identified needs.
- Partnership: ≥ 2 certified sending organisations from 2 different countries and ≥ 2 certified hosting organisations; may include other partner organisations specialised in any areas relevant to the objectives or the actions of the project and associates
- Volunteers: junior or senior professionals (more than 5 years' experience)
- Apprenticeship (junior professionals): in one of the participating EU
 Member States for max. 6 months
- List of countries for 2016 for deployment and capacity building in third countries to be published shortly

Technical assistance



Capacity building

- Call to be published: 2nd quarter 2016
- Objective: Strengthening the capacities of sending and hosting organisations intending to participate in the initiative and ensuring compliance with the standards and procedures.
- Partnership for TA: organisations from ≥ 3 EU countries; applicant active in the humanitarian aid field for at least 3 years; applicant or one of partner active in the volunteer management for at least 3 years;
- Partnership for CB: organisations from ≥ 3 EU countries and ≥ 3 third countries in which humanitarian aid take place; all EU organisations active in the humanitarian aid field for at least 3 years; at least 2 third countries' organisations are active in the humanitarian aid field; applicant or one of partner active in the volunteer management for at least 3 years;



The **application package** contains the following parts:

- 1. Application form: e-Form
- 2. Supporting documents as annexes to the e-Form and submitted electronically with the application form:
- Detailed budget/ Indicative breakdown/ Operational capacity/ Financial capacity (Excel file)
- Work plan
- Declaration of honour (PDF)
- Mandates (PDF)
